Rock 'n' Roll	Rock 'n' roll is a form of rock music developed in the 1950s and 1960s. The drum kit, also called "the drums," is a group of percussion instruments arranged so that they can be played by one person. The guitar is a string instrument which is played by plucking the strings. A verse is a series of lyrics that tell the main story of the song and keep the action or thoughts moving forward. A chorus is a repeated section that contains the primary musical and lyrical motifs of the song. The güiro is a Latin American percussion instrument consisting of an open-ended, hollow gourd with parallel notches cut in one side. It is played by rubbing a stick or tines along the notches to produce a ratchet-like sound. Jazz is an original style of American Music. It is a unique blend of many styles of music including gospel music, brass bands, African music, blues, and Spanish music.	Weeks	Musician	Song	Making comparisons	Jazz and rock are two of the most widely celebrated musical genres of all time. While their popularity is certainly on equal terms, their style is very much different. And while they may have similar beginnings, they have branched so differently over the years. 1. Jazz started during the early part of the 20th century in the African-American communities. 2. Rock started in the 1960s and is a combination of jazz, country, and classical music primarily. 3. Jazz music can be orchestrated from sounds produced by a mixture of wind and string instruments and percussions. Rock is mostly from electric string instruments accompanied by drum beats. 4. Jazz has an air of sophistication and style and is considerably hard to perform. Rock is wild, frantic and loud but easier to perform.
